artist's statement

There is no a central theme as such. My art is a research made to understand better and to sort out what is going on around. Therefore it is natural that on the basis of these researches some new socio-critical works appear. Working in the street is the basic practice. Pasted-up graphic works drawn with black ink appeal to ordinary, intelligent people. The first project We are not marginal! was pasted up in 2007. That was a private research on marginality in the Ukrainian art-context. In 2009 critical works Why morality? and My porn my right were pasted up as a reaction to the activity of the then existing National Expert Commission of Ukraine on the Protection of Public Morality that had passed the law which prohibited to keep pornography on personal computers and forced internet service providers to spy upon users and to report on users in case they visit forbidden web-sites. The Commission as well prohibited the book Woman of his dreams by a Ukrainian writer Oles' Ulyanenko. In 2009-2010 some other critical works were created against homophobia and destruction of the historic centre of Kyiv. Homophobia, homosexuality are other theme I work with a lot. The main work among homosexual works is my art-book The most pornographic book of the world (2008) that consists of 100 pages and non-linearly narrates about rigid, comfortless feelings of Ukrainian youths. Music and music performance play a great role in my art. In 2006-2008 I was the lead singer of avant-garde absurdist performance group Penoplast (Foam Plastic). Now I continue to make music with group Lyudska Podoba. It is avant-garde pop, dance and lyric music with absurdist true-to-life. Im also writing a screenplay in collaboration with Yevgeniya Belorusets and I want to shoot a musical about people who are trying to understand each other, to help each other. There is as well a theme of a foreigner in the alien cultural context. The idea with the film stroked me after I had visited Austrian residency <ROTOR> in Graz in 2009.
